Wesley Middleton, 1813-1885, the sixth child of John Middleton and Elizabeth Downing-Middleton, was born in Franklin County, Ohio, May 22, 1813. He was married Oct. 31, 1835, by Richard S. Robison, preacher of the gospel, to his cousin, Lovina Downing, who was born Aug. 4, 1819, in Franklin County, Ohio. She died near Elkhart, Ind., Mar. 15, 1870, and is buried in Rowe Cemetery. Lovina was the daughter of David Downing and Polly Middleton, who died in the spring of 1830 on the journey from Ohio to Indiana. Lovina was even tempered and an excellent mother for she was sweet and kind to all who came within her reach.

Uncle Wesley was a farmer living most of his life at Sugar Grove, Ind., six miles east of Elkhart. He was kind and liberal and of the Methodist creed. A large physique enhanced by very broad shoulders and his ability to talk well and debate earned for him the position of neighborhood councillor and advisor. He was rather well educated and was a "peti-fogie" lawyer for he settled community disputes when the occasion arose and at times even filled neighboring pulpits. Family relationship was always very dear to him. At one time he traveled to Bristol, Ind., to see if he could establish some relationship with a Joel Middleton living there, but they could find no family connections. Wesley was married a to Orland, Ind. He died Feb. 11, 1885, at the home of his youngest child and is buried beside his wife, Lovina, in the Rowe Cemetry. Issue:

Sarah Howard Middleton, 1815-1899, the seventh child of John Middleton and Elizabeth Downing-Middleton, was born Apr. 28, 1815, in Franklin County, Ohio. Her outstanding physical characteristic was her beautiful brown hair which was such a contrast to her four sisters' black hair. Aunt Sally was married Dec. 10, 1838, by George M. Boyd, a Methodist minister, to Manasiah Minear, born Nov. 30, 1788, who was always called Uncle Charley by his nieces and nephews. The name Minear is of an old family, dating from the first John Minear who came over from Germany in 1750. Uncle Charley died Jan. 11, 1852, and is buried beside Jonathan Middleton, his brother-in-law, in the Middleton Cemetery at Elkhart, Ind.

Aunt Sally lived near Elkhart until the spring of 1866 when she with her daughters Jane and Eliza Ann Zieber, Frederick Zieber and their four children migrated to Putnam County, Mo., in a covered wagon and settled where the town of Livonia now stands. The purpose of the trip was to obtain land which, at that time, was very cheap in Missouri. The remainder of her life was lived in Missouri and she died of pneumonia at her home in Livonia on March 4, 1899, where her married daughter, Jane Sorrell, lived with her. She is buried there. Eliza Henry Middleton, 1816-1902, the eighth child of John Middleton and Elizabeth Downing-Middleton, was born in Franklin Co., Ohio, on Dee. 15, 1816. She shared all of the deprivations of pioneer life in Ohio and Indiana with her parents, brothers, and sisters. She was the sister who came with her brothers and sister-in-law in the spring of 1829 to Elkhart Co., Ind., when only thirteen years old to choose location for the Middleton homestead, to build a one-room log cabin, to put in the erop and harvest it before returning to Franklin Co., Ohio, that fall. On April 23, 1838, she was married in Elkhart Co., Ind., by G. Rumsy, Justice of the Peace, to James Settle of an old Virginia family from Culpeper Co., Va., as Gaston Settle died there in 1707.

Uncle Jim Settle was a large man, loosely built, a typical Southerner, sometimes wore whiskers on his chin, was a very kind hearted gentleman and lived to be old. In 1854, he moved his family to near Red Rock, Marino Co., Jowa. When the Civil War began, he moved his family back to Elkhart where they stayed during the war, as the sons John, Merriman and James had enlisted in the army in Iowa. After the war, the Settle family returned to Marion Co., Iowa, and Uncle Jim died near Red. Rock 1870 and is buried in the Teeter Cemetery there.

Aunt Eliza's hair was ahiny black as was all her sisters except Sarah. Before her marriage she worked in the Downing Tavern at Elkhart, Ind., and later when the Tavern contents were sold she bought some of the articles. Among them was a candle stick which she gave to her youngest sister, Elizabeth Ann Mitchel, who gave it to her second daughter Rhoda who sent it by Edna Middleton Kendall Aug. 4, 1929, to her daughter Hazel May Middleton Kendall, who now possesses the cherished brass candle stick.

At one time, Aunt Eliza visited and stayed with some Downing relatives in Clinton, 1997 The relationship is unknown but the following copy of a letter written by the relative to Eliza's father is of much interest:

"To John Middleton, Senr.

You will recollect that I told you whenever you wrote that Katherin's money was ready. I would come immediately out after it and bring Eliza home. As I do not wish to make two trips now, as soon as you will write me that Katherin's money is ready, I will come out immediately and bring Eliza home. Sarah thought that if she gets married and moved to Pennsylvania that she has my best wishes for her prosperity. Eliza says you need not think it strange that if you should hear of my matrimonial engagement in my next letter. But be that as it may, if you write as I have requested, I will come and see you before I lay hold on felicity. I have frequently wrote and got but few answers. You will please to write to me immediately on the receipt of this letter. Eliza is living with me at this time and was sick some time back but has recovered. My wife had a fine son on the 23rd of January and I talk of calling him Henry Clay. We have had a very cold winter. Pork is selling from 450 to 500 better per lb. Beef from 3 to 4. Corn 33 cts. per bushel, oats 25, wheat 100, flour 100 barrel. The markets are much higher than they have ever been known in this country. You will please present my best respects and warmest wishes to all my relatives and enquiring friends. I have more to write at present that will be interesting to you but ever remain Nephew until death.

This letter, now in possession of Dora Mitchel-Light of Elkhart, Ind., is written in ink on a large sheet of faded paper folded so as to make its own envelope and sealed on the back with a drop of wax. The script though plainly written is of the old fashioned type and required much time to decipher.

No trace of these Downings can be found by the disc constraints y records of Clinton County, the deside that have a land was ever held by persons in that County under the name of Downing.

In her late years, Aunt Eliza lived much with her son, John Middleton Settle and wife Martha. She was a great lover of flowers and yearly raised herself a bed of them. She was a Dunkard and always wore plain clothes, "a

dress with cape?' and her bonnet. When older, she developed cataract on her eyes and was blind in her last years. She died in Pleasantville, Iowa, Mar. 15, 1902, and is buried beside her husband in the Teeter Cemetery near Red Rock, Marion Co., Iowa. Issue:
