David Downing Middleton, 1818-1876, the ninth child of John Middleton and Elizabeth Downing-Middleton, was born in Franklin County, Ohio, Nov. 8, 1818, married about 1843 or ' '4 to Tina Martha Gillum, sister to Rebecca Gillum who married his brother, William Middleton. He must have left Ellkhart County in the spring of 1860 for the deed records in Plymouth, Ind., show that David D. Middleton bought Apr. 18, 1850, East one-half of south east one-fourth, Section thirteen, Twp. thirty-two, Range one, eighty acres for $\$ 250.00$. On June 14, 1851, he sold this for $\$ 400.00$. On Sept. 13, 1851, David and wife, Tina, sold to the Methodist Episcopal Church in Plymouth, Ind., ehurch site in N. E. corner of east one-half of S. E. one-fourth for $\$ 10.00$. Aunt Tina died May 25, 1865, and was buried near Queen City, Mo. David d. May 1876 Lancaster, Mo.

Uncle Dave was of medium height, dark complexion, was kind, industrious, honest, and trustworthy. He was a conscientious Christian man and was superintendent of the Sunday School for years at Queen City, Mo. He was very active in church work and always tried to set a good example for his family and neighbors. He taught school in his younger life. Once or twice he returned to Indiana on visits. He was a farmer and yearly exchanged visits with his western brothers and sisters. 歇 lived in Iowa for a time and when he left there the old Bible was temporarily left with a cousin, Bess Monroe at Humeston, and later their house burned with the Bible in it. This was regretted very much but the family was unsettled and expected to get it soon as located.

Joseph Bigelow Middleton, 1820-1894, the tenth child of John Middleton and 太lizabeth Downing-Midaleton, was born in Franklin Co., Ohio, on Aug. 20, 1820. He moved to Ellkhart Co., Ind., with his parents and relatives when nine years old. The Indians were so numerous that his playmates were Indian boys. They could beat him shooting with the bow and arrow but he could out run them in a foot race. When a young man, he freighted wheat to Fort Dearborn (Chicago). He and his brother David were constant companions for they attended an Amish school together, farmed the Michigan Fity land in LaPorte Co., Ind., and voted first together. Joseph looked older than David, so when they went to vote, David was challenged but not Joseph who voted in June before he was twenty-one in August.

Uncle Joe was married May 11, 1845, by M. E. minister, Eventus Doud, to Sarah Jane Adams on applieation of Elijah Adams in Elkhart Co., Ind. She was the daughter of John and Eve Adams and was born on June 6, 1824. Aunt Sarah Jane died July 7, 1856, and is buried in the old Goshen Cem. at Goshen, Ind., for their home was near Goshen. Uncle Joe was a pupil in her school before he married her.

In 1865, Uncle Joe, saddened by the death of his beloved wife, moved with his four children to Missouri travelling by horses and wagons. Conditions were very unsettled at that time and a new country brought hopes of better health for himself and children; also land could be homesteaded in Missouri as the sons Orin and Oral were old enough to be wanting land soon. He was a suecessful farmer and accumblated large holdings. In polities he was a Republican and in religion, a Methodist.

Uncle Joe did all he could to educate his children and taught them that what was worth doing at all was worth doing well. Not forgetting the origin of that proud family, he taught his children early in their lives, the names of the three counties in Delaware. He was always good and kind, kept his children together and was both father and mother to them, for he loved his children, his home and friends. His grandchildren were a pleasure and usually one of them lived with

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him. His pet name for every child was "my chickadees," as he called them and all remembered their exceedingly good times at "grandpa's." His home was a haven for many unfortunate orphans and aged, homeless people. He told his children about playing with the Indians, hunting deer, how the deer shed its horns, and travelled in winter, and about the gild fruit and flowers in Indiana and Ohio.

Joseph Bigelow Middleton inherited the Middleton family Bible from his father; John Middleton. The old Bible is size four by eight by eleven inches, covered with natural colored leather, and is stereotyped by B. \& J. Collins, N. Y., 1818. The pages are printed with very narrow margin and the chapters are numbered with the Roman numerals in very small type. The Middleton family record is written with ink brown with age, and is readable yet not so plain or distinct. The old Bible is now in possession of Alitia A. Scott-Lowry, grand-daughter of Joseph Bigelow Middleton, at Mercer, Mo.

In later years Uncle Joe was white haired and wore a long white beard. He cared for a wonderful orchard as his hobby, culled grain and mowed hay. With two of his youngest daughters, a large yard was kept in perfect condition, for in the summers it was swept with hazel-brush. When too feeble to look after the up-keep of his large farm and stock, and after one of the daughtèrs, Ina, was married, he and daughter Entoca moved into the little town of Ravanna, Mo. This daughter never cared to marry as long as her father lived for she thought he needed her more than anyone else. He was always in fairly good health and of bright intellect until the last when he passed away Oct. 10, 1894, and is buried in the Lowry-Snyder Cem., Mercer Co., Mo., beside his second wife, Nancy.
